### Task 2:

Some people believe workers should have to retire, or stop working, at a certain age. Other people believe older people's experience can help a company. Do you think there should be a required retirement age? Explain, giving specific reasons for your choice.

*There is a reason as to why retirement is a thing, and I personally think that whether or not or when a person retires is mostly up to them, but there may be exceptions.*

*As people get older, the state of their health generally gets worse. The elderly, for example, have problems with walking, hearing, seeing, talking and many other actions as well due to the fact that their health is not as great as it used to be. They start losing their cognitive abilities, as well as their physical abilities. This is the general rule, but there are exceptions. There are people who have managed to live over 100 years, yet they can still run and swim and do other mental activities near perfectly, and there are bound to be others like that, thought they may be younger. If such people are forced to retire, then that means lots of potential is being wasted, and it would be beneficial to the company if that person were to stay at his post or possibly be given an easier job, so as to minimize the chances of the employee making a mistake and causing a problem, which is likely to happen if the employee was facing cognitive or physical malfunctions due to their health being affected by age.*

*So the choice to retire should be up to the employees since they may still be in perfect shape for their current job, or they may still be fit for a simpler job, such as teachin or passing on his/ her knowledge and wisdom via lectures. There shouldn't be a "required retirement age," when somebody retires should be dependent on the person.*
